# New items on the program

New to the trade fair is the <u>Environmental Technologies Conference</u>, which is being organized by the Indian think tank *The Energy and Resources Institute* (TERI). On the first day of the fair, there will be CEO forums looking at urban water management, solid waste management and air pollution control. On September 27, renowned experts will deal these topics in more detail with panel discussions and presentations.

IFAT India is also the ideal platform for politics. The <u>Business to Government</u> <u>Forum</u> will be held for the first time, giving government representatives an opportunity to report on current environmental projects and establish contacts with appropriate technology providers. Among the participants who have already signed up is Mr. Manjeet Singh, Principal Secretary for the government in the Indian state of Rajasthan.

### **Proven magnets for visitors**

The Active Learning Center, the public's favorite feature last year, will also offer a host of practical events this year. The Products in Practice event format allows visitors to try out systems for managing heavy rainfall, for example. And in the Water Skills Competition, they can test their knowledge when it comes to operating sewage treatment works and other wastewater treatment facilities. There is also plenty on offer for young people. The University Challenge, now taking place for the third time, will allow students to gain their first experience of integrated resource management.
